

Cost and outcomes of cancer in the Nordic countries

The role of the steering committee:

In order to ensure that the results of the study have the desired impact, a steering committee is appointed. The steering committee will bring additional expertise to the research team in terms of industry experience and stakeholder understanding.

The role of the steering committee is to oversee the validity and reliability of the study, as well as to ensure that the results of the study are relevant to all stakeholders. The main task of the steering committee is to ensure that the results of the study have practical relevance and can be used by decision makers in the society. The steering committee representatives will also monitor ethical considerations within the project.

The steering committee will constitute of one member from each Nordic country. The steering committee will have (skype) meetings three times a year from the start of the project.

Steering committee tasks:

- One member is designated from each country
- The steering committee chooses a chair
- The steering committee meets regularly (three times a year)
- The research group reports to the steering committee on the progress of the study and of the results once they are available
- The steering committee prepares and submits to the NCU board updates on the progress of the project
- The steering committee prepares and submits to NCU board a description of the expected societal impact of the research project. The mid-term results shall be reported at the NCU meeting in the autumn of 2019, and final results in the spring of 2020.
